“Career Development Grants provide funding to women who hold a bachelor’s degree and are preparing to advance or change careers or re-enter the workforce in education; health and medical sciences; science, technology, engineering, and math (STEM); or social sciences. Primary consideration is given to women of color and women pursuing their first advanced degree or credentials in nontraditional fields.

Today, grants support course work beyond a bachelor’s degree, including a master’s degree, second bachelor’s degree, certification program or specialized training in technical or professional fields. Course work must be taken at an accredited two- or four-year college or university in the United States or at a technical school that is fully licensed or accredited by the U.S. Department of Education. Funds are not available for doctorate-level work.”

## Wayne F. Placek Grants

“Wayne F. Placek was initially a research subject of Evelyn Hooker, a groundbreaking psychologist whose 1950s research laid the foundation for the view that homosexuality was not a form of psychopathology. Ultimately, Hooker’s research led to the removal of homosexuality as a clinical diagnosis. Placek, a gay man who participated in Hooker’s studies, was so moved by her work that he left his entire estate to her. He instructed that the money be used to advance the general public’s understanding of LGBTQ+ individuals and reduce the stress and adversity experienced by members of the LGBTQ+ community. Today, the Wayne F. Placek Grant has funded over \$1 million in LGBTQ+ research.

The Wayne F. Placek Grant encourages research to increase the general public's understanding of homosexuality and sexual orientation, and to alleviate the stress that lesbian women, gay men, bisexual women, bisexual men, and transgender individuals experience in this and future civilizations. Since 1995, the Placek Fund has granted more than \$1 million.

The Wayne F. Placek Grant encourages research that addresses the following topics:

- heterosexuals' attitudes and behaviors toward lesbian, gay, bisexual, and transgender (LGBT) people, including prejudice, discrimination, and violence
- family and workplace issues relevant to LGBT people
- special concerns of sectors of the LGBT population that have historically been underrepresented in scientific research”

## Steven O. Walfish Grants

“The Steven O. Walfish Grants supported by the APA Division 42 Next Generation Fund promote and support the next generation of student and early career practitioner psychologists to expand the knowledge base in the practice of psychology.

Applicants are required to submit manuscripts on clinical, practical, or research innovations that address evolving standards, practices, and methods in psychological practice. Topics may include population-based practice issues, procedure or technique-based practice issues, diagnosis-based practice issues, or service delivery models describing a practice innovation.

Grant recipients are encouraged to use the grant to attend the APA convention to present their work. The papers of the grant recipients may qualify for publication in the APA Division 42 journal, *Practice Innovations*.

Up to two \$2,500 grants are available to graduate students (within 2 years or less of completing the doctoral degree) and/or early career psychologists (within 10 years of earning the doctoral degree).

Winner(s) will receive a 1-year free membership to Division 42.”

## **David H. and Beverly A. Barlow Grant**

“David H. Barlow, PhD, ABPP, is Professor Emeritus of Psychology and Psychiatry at Boston University. He also serves as an APF Honorary Trustee.

Dr. Barlow is a pioneer in the field of anxiety and anxiety-related disorders. He is the founder and director emeritus of the Center for Anxiety and Related Disorders at Boston University, which has been pivotal in researching, understanding, and treating neuroticism, anxiety, and emotional disorders. Throughout his career, he has published over 600 articles and chapters and over 75 books and clinical manuals, in the areas of anxiety, emotional disorders, and clinical research methodology. The profound contributions of his work have earned him over 40 awards and honors.

At this stage in David and Beverly’s careers, they hope to continue supporting innovative and impactful research. Dr. and Mrs. Barlow have generously funded the David H. and Beverly A. Barlow Grant, which supports graduate students and early career psychologists conducting clinical research on anxiety and other related disorders.

Proposals will be evaluated on:

- quality, viability, and potential impact of the proposed project
- originality, innovation, and contribution to the field of anxiety
- applicant’s demonstrated competence and capability to execute the proposed work
- criticality of funding for execution of work (particularity if part of a larger funded effort)”
